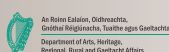
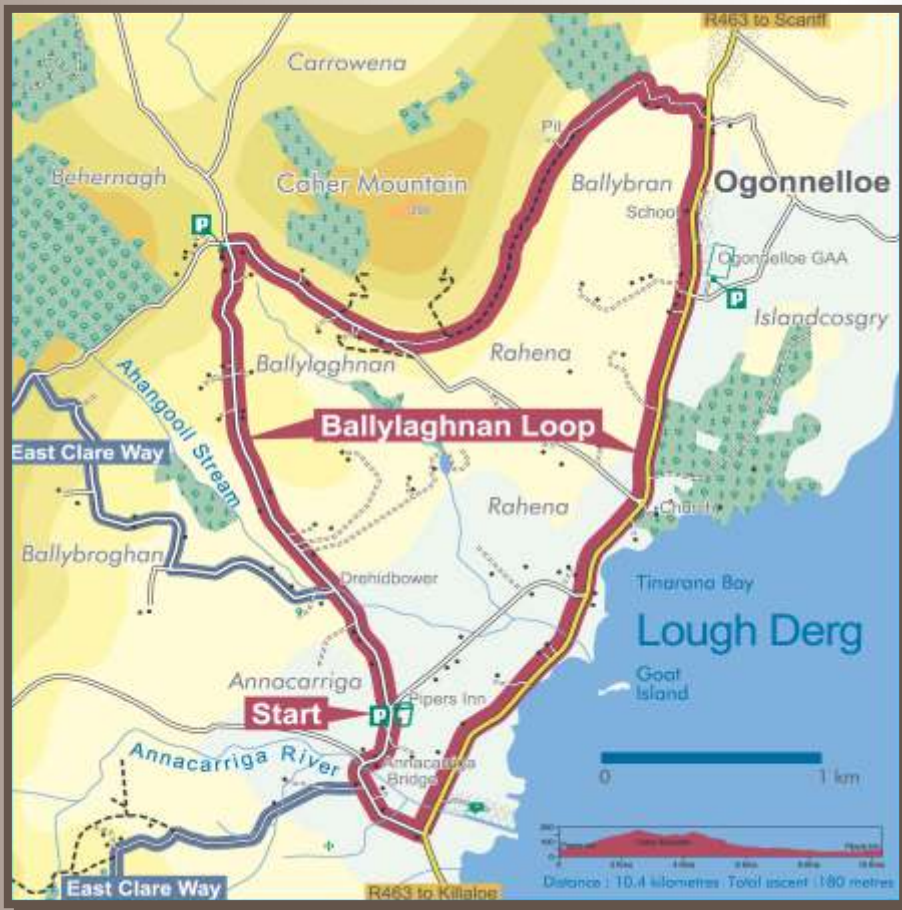


## Slí na Méaracán / The Mid Clare Way

## Ballylaghnan Loop

### GRADE:

**Moderate** – Trail may have some climbs and may have an uneven surface where the going is rough underfoot with some obstacles. Suitable for people with a moderate level of fitness and some walking experience. Sturdy hiking boots, warm and waterproof clothing, fluid, sun protection, snack and mobile phone are recommended.

**ESTIMATED TIME TO COMPLETE:** 2 - 2.5 hours

**WAY-MARKING:** Yellow arrow on black background

### DESCRIPTION:

Starting at the Piper's Inn, take a right where you will walk uphill following a low grade road until you reach St. Mary's Church in the townland of Ballylaghnan. Opposite the church, take a right turn, again following low grade road until you reach a junction. Keep left at this point and follow the narrow road/track where you will enjoy fantastic views of Lough Derg and the Arra mountains on the Tipperary side of the lake. Shortly after the old quarry, follow the road to the right travelling downhill towards the R463 Killaloe to Scariff road. Care is needed crossing the road at this point. Turn right and follow the footpath walking alongside Lough Derg. Continue towards Annacarriga and shortly after Annacarriga bridge, turn right. The walker again needs to cross the R463 so care is needed. Continue straight on this road returning to the Piper's Inn.

This walking trail has been developed with kind assistance of local landowners and organisations. Please respect these landowners, their fencing and their livestock, by parking in designated areas only and staying on the official trail.

It is understood that if persons enter private land they do so by permission and with the consent of the landowners and no matter how often they enter, or in what numbers, they do not do so as of any right.
